


OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES - VISITING A FARM

This unit of work is based on a visit to a farm. The following areas of English Language Arts (ELA) have been integrated: Grammar, Spelling and Vocabulary.



In this unit of work, you will:

- describe ongoing/progressive actions (**Grammar**)
- produce the following correctly: words that drop the final 'e' before adding '-ing' (**Spelling**)
- produce the following correctly: words that double the final consonant before adding '-ing' (**Spelling**)
- make new words by adding the suffix '-ly' to root words (**Vocabulary**)

NOTE

The **Present Continuous Tense** is used to state actions that are happening at the moment. It is formed by using the following:

Present tense of the verb 'to be'

Most verbs ending with 'e' drop the 'e' before adding '-ing'.

dance → dancing

Verbs ending with *consonant-short vowel sound-consonant (cvc)* double the last consonant before adding '-ing'.

run → running clap → clapping


drum → drumming
