
Key Points:

- We can use the words **thin** and **thick**, **wide** and **narrow** to describe objects.
- We also use the words **slim** and **fat** especially when we speak of people.
- **Heavy** and **light** are words we use to compare things or to speak about them. If something is easy to carry, we say it is **light**. If we cannot carry it easily, we say it is **heavy**.

Observe the pictures below:



These books are thick.



This piece of wood is wide.



These mats are thin.



This piece of wood is narrow.



Here, the watermelon is **heavy**, while the apple is **light**. Hence the arm with the watermelon is lower than the arm with the apple.




These balloons are light.


This computer is **heavy**
